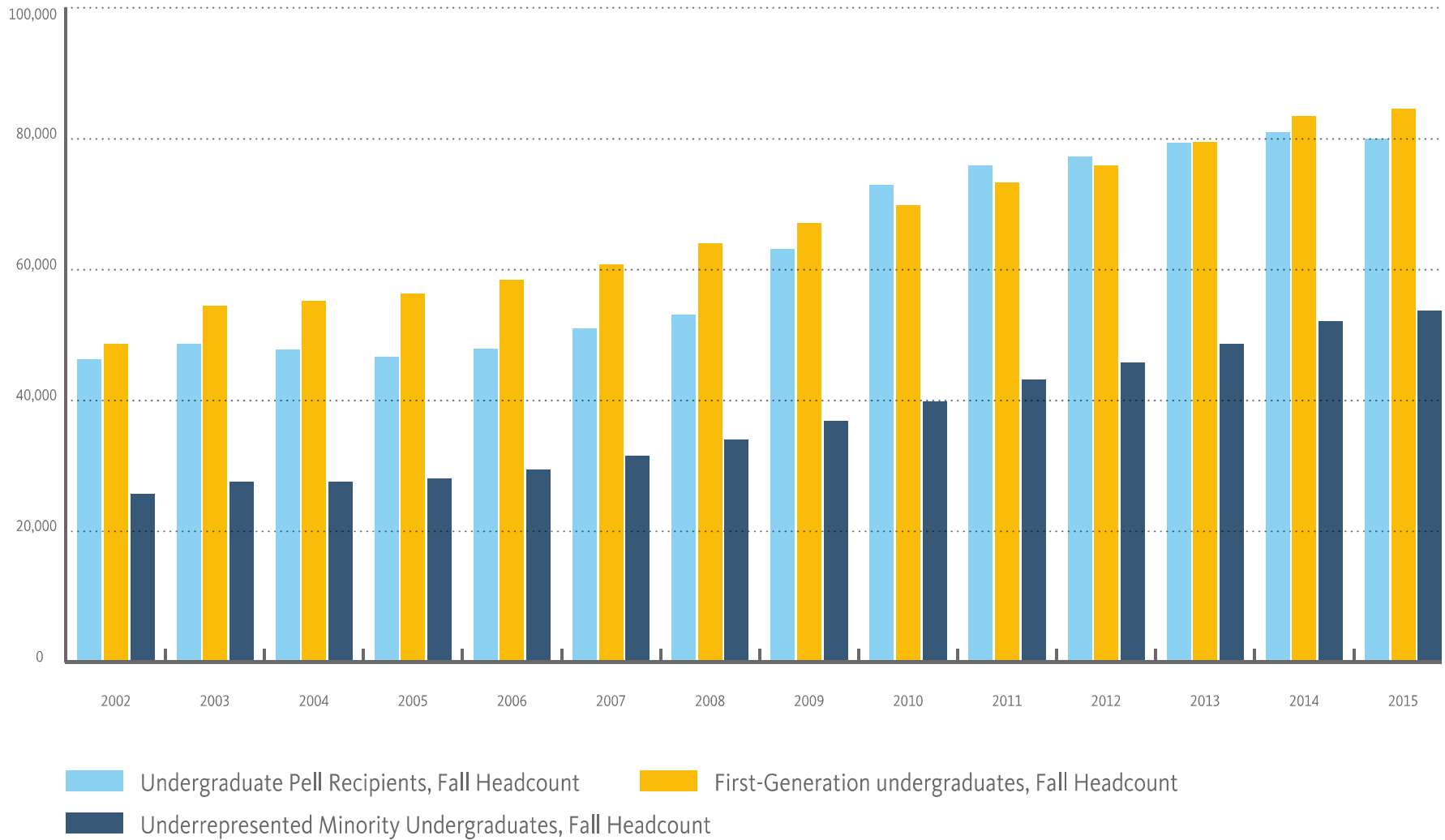

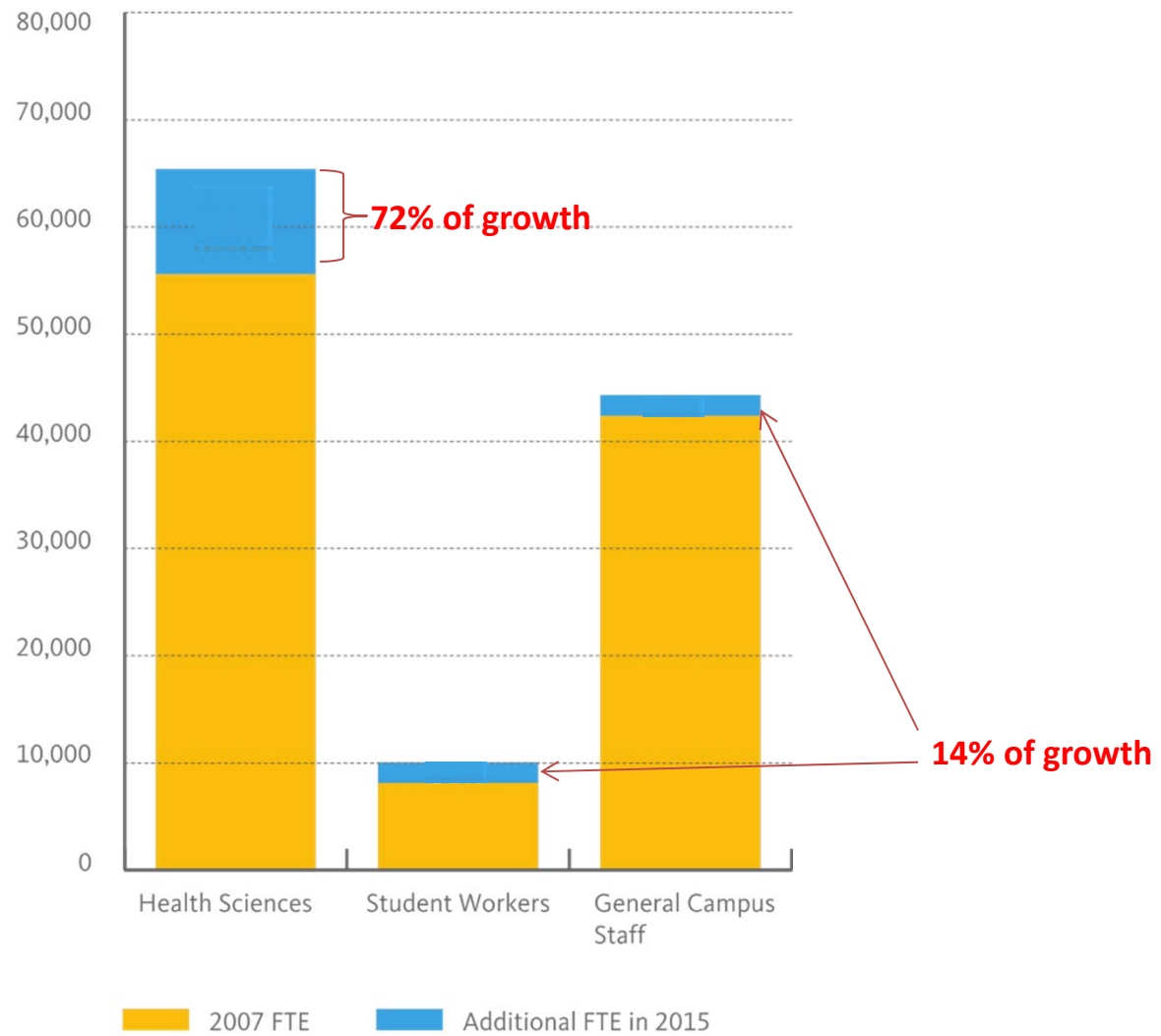

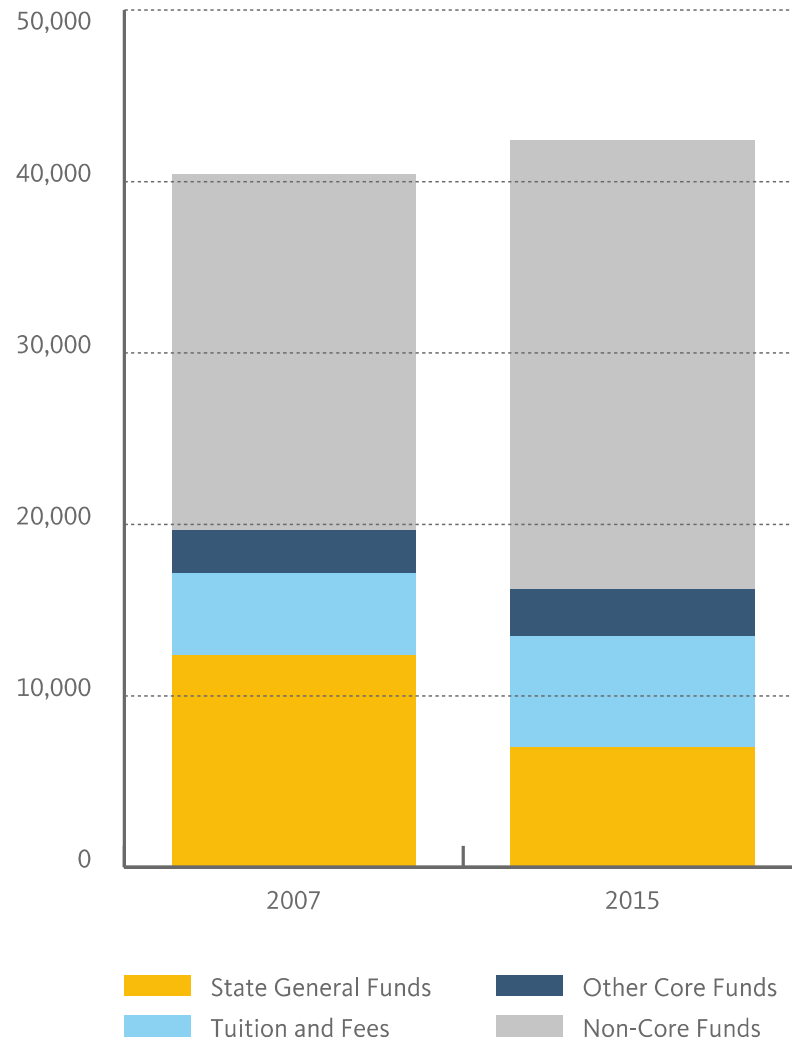
The Number of UC Undergraduate Pell Grant, First Generation College and Underrepresented Minorities Has Grown Over Time



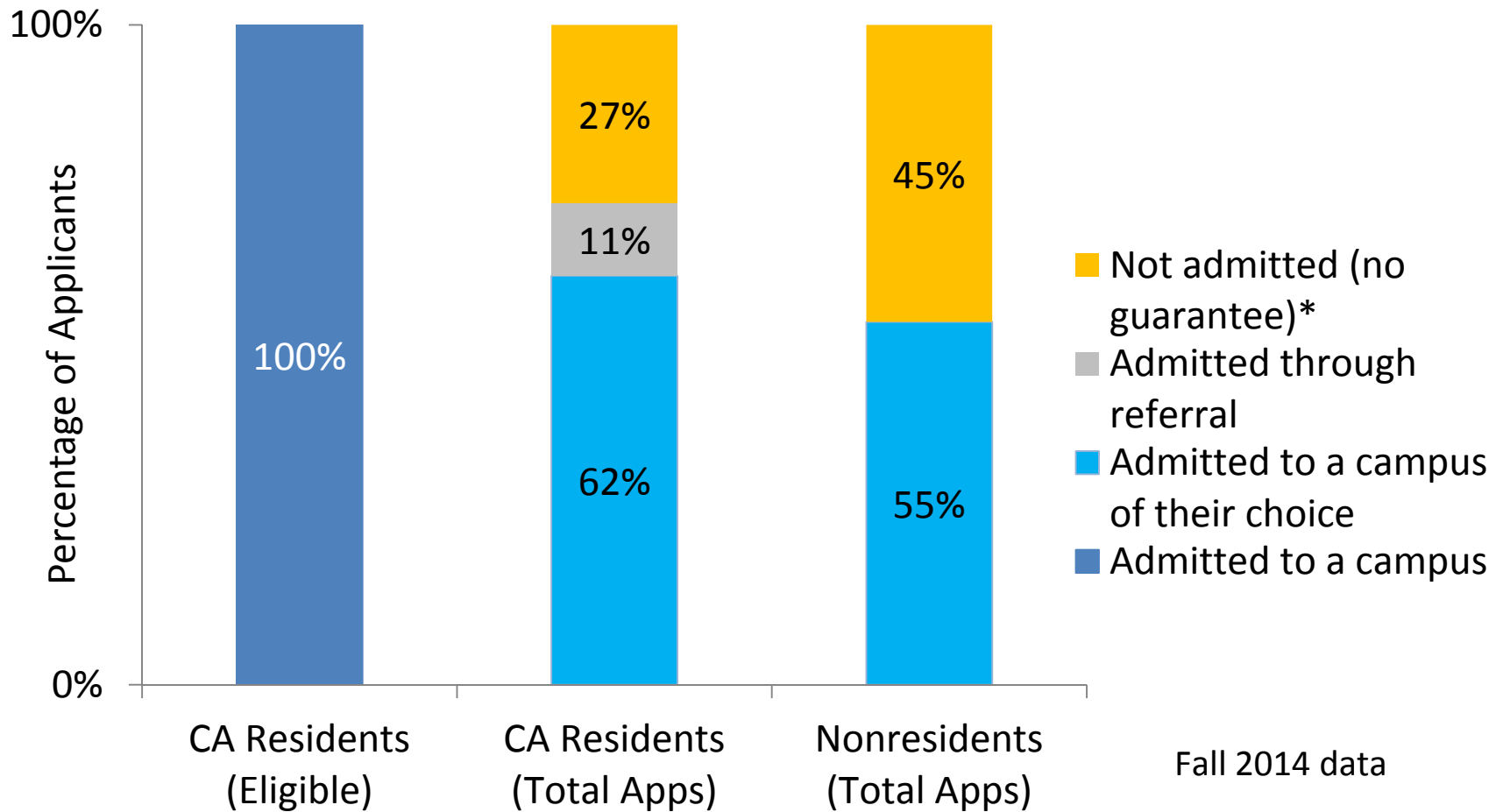
Most Staff Growth Occurred in Medical Centers

Eligible California residents are guaranteed admission—nonresidents are not—and a greater proportion of California residents are admitted to a campus of their choice than nonresidents



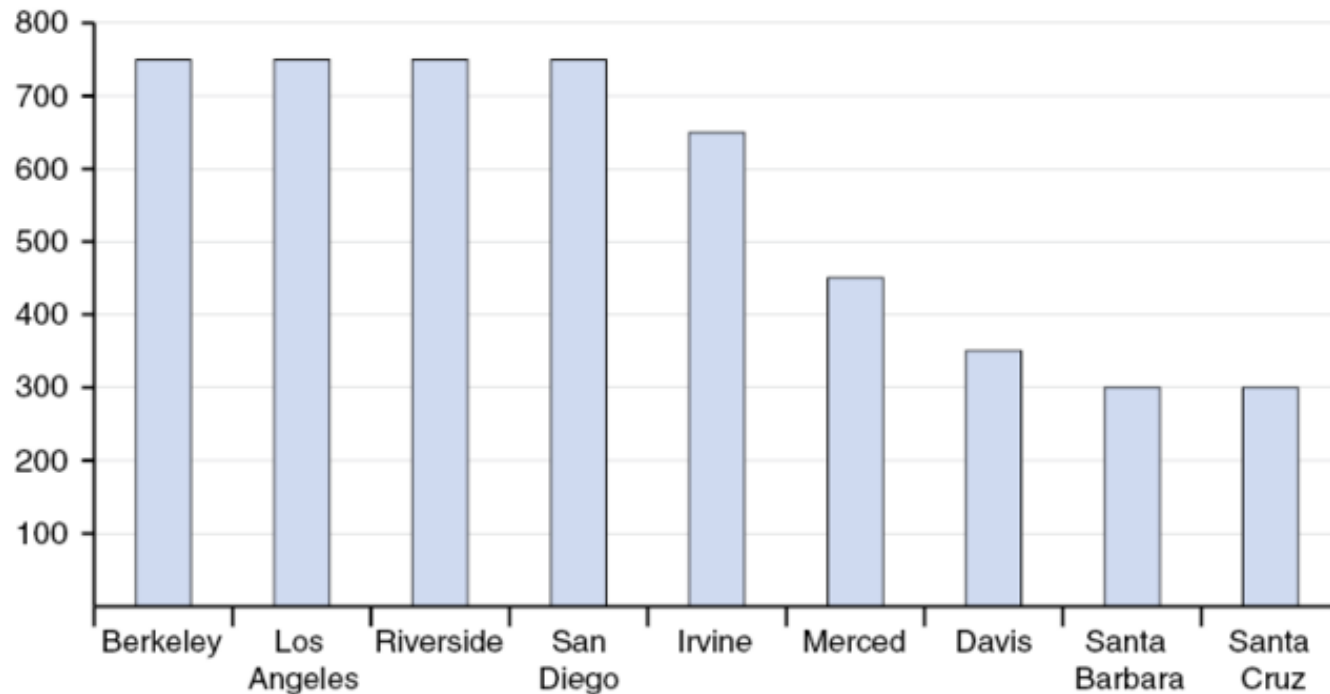
* CA residents who are ineligible and nonresidents who are denied

UC's Growth Plan, 2016-17 Compared to 2014-15

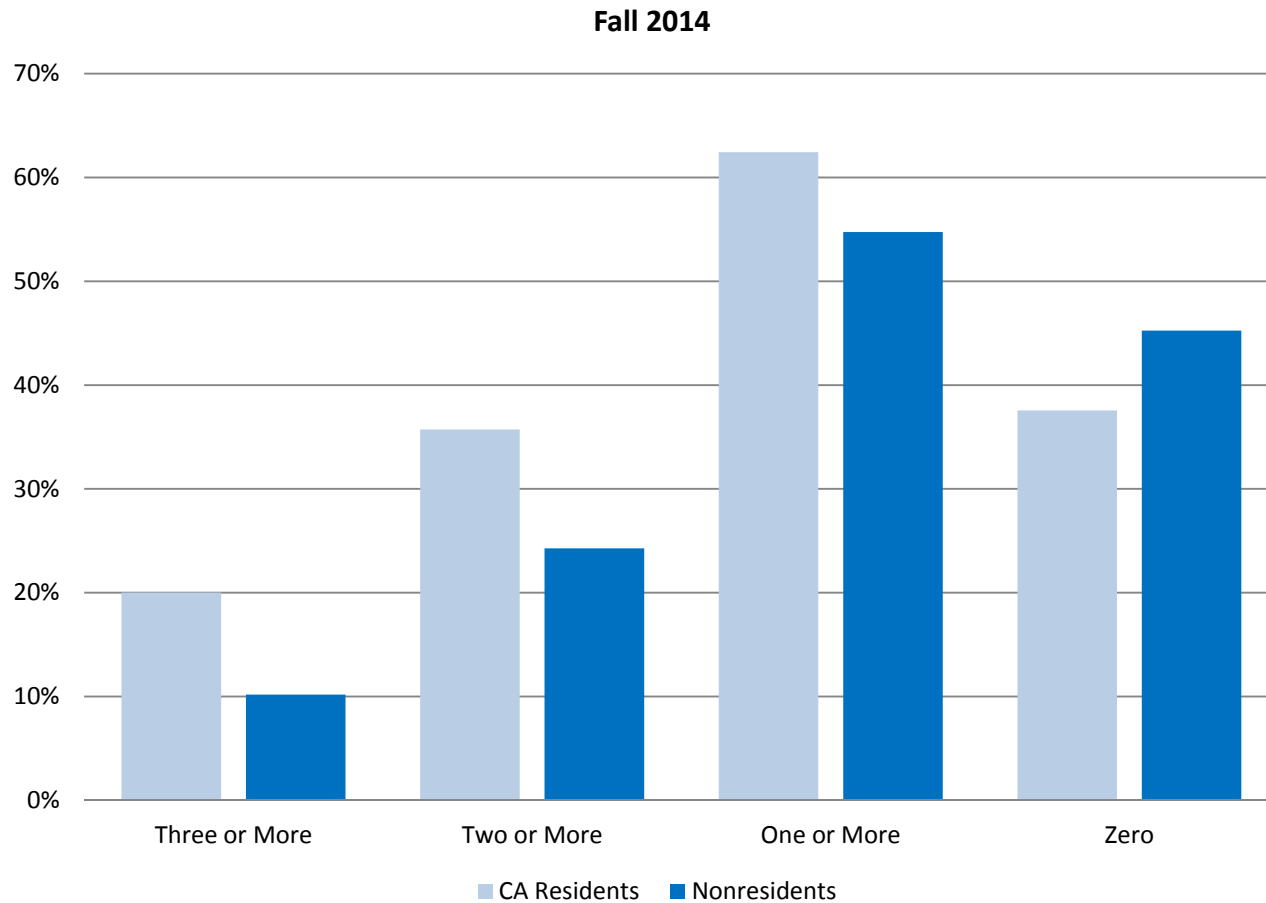
