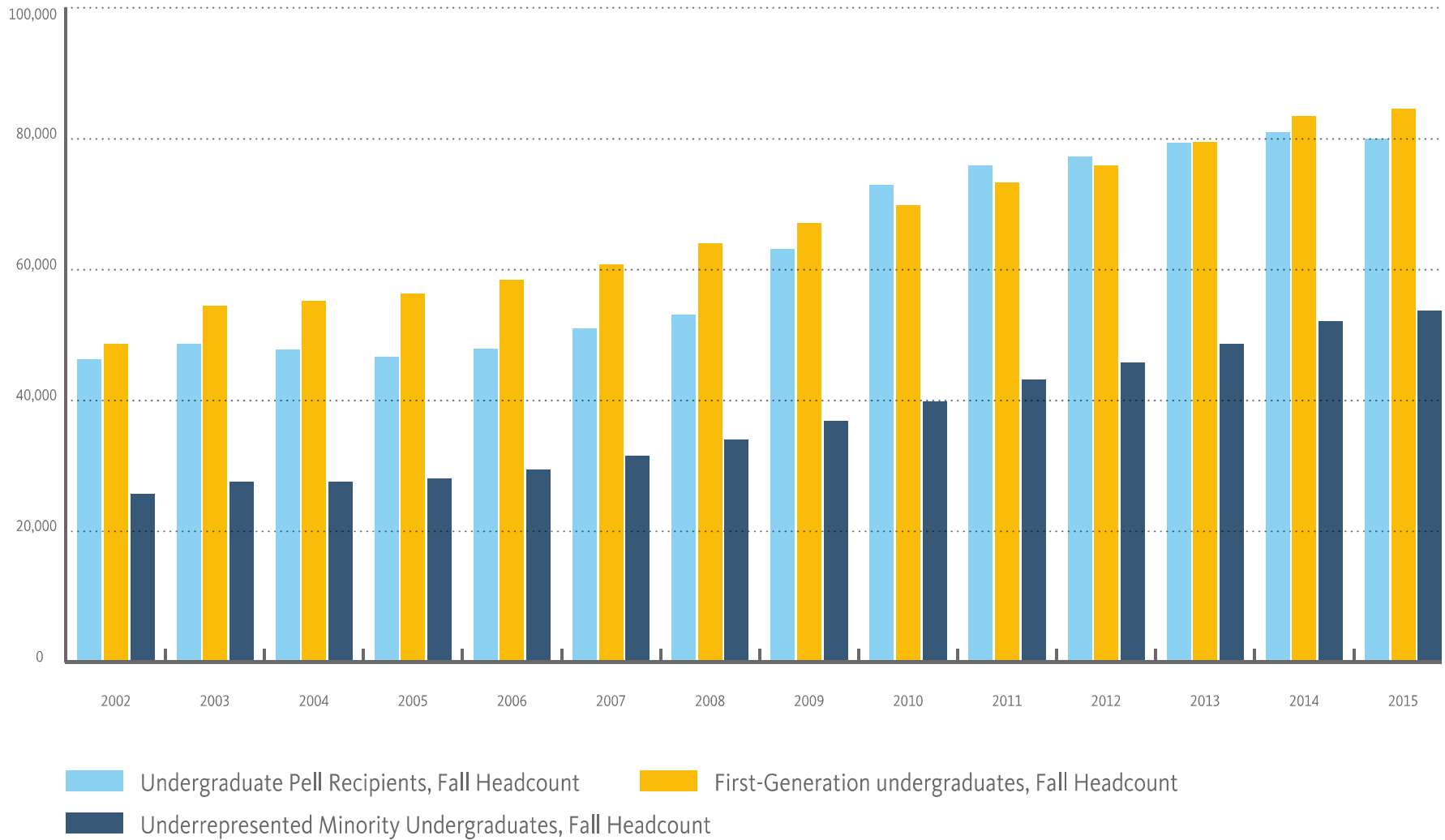

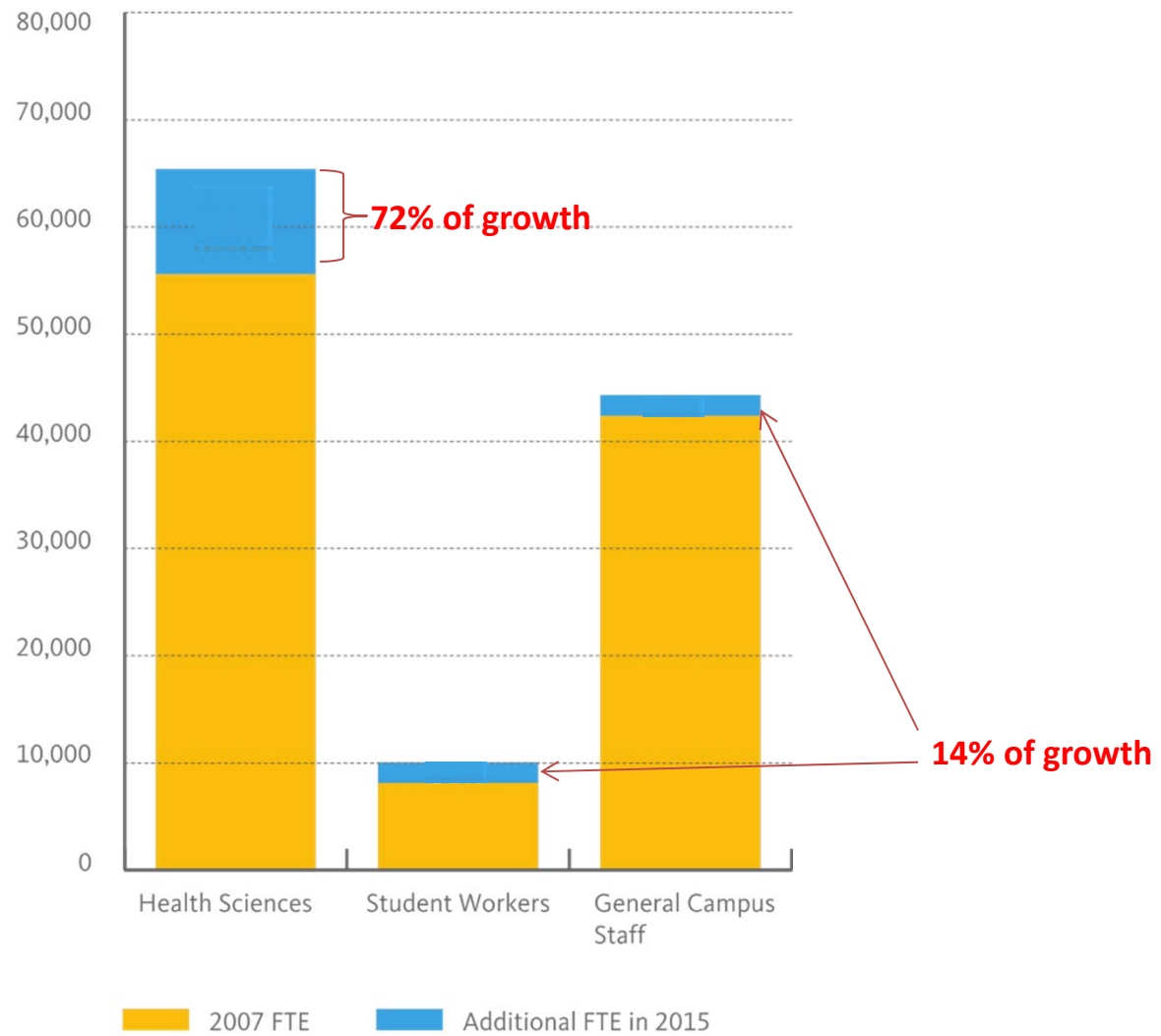

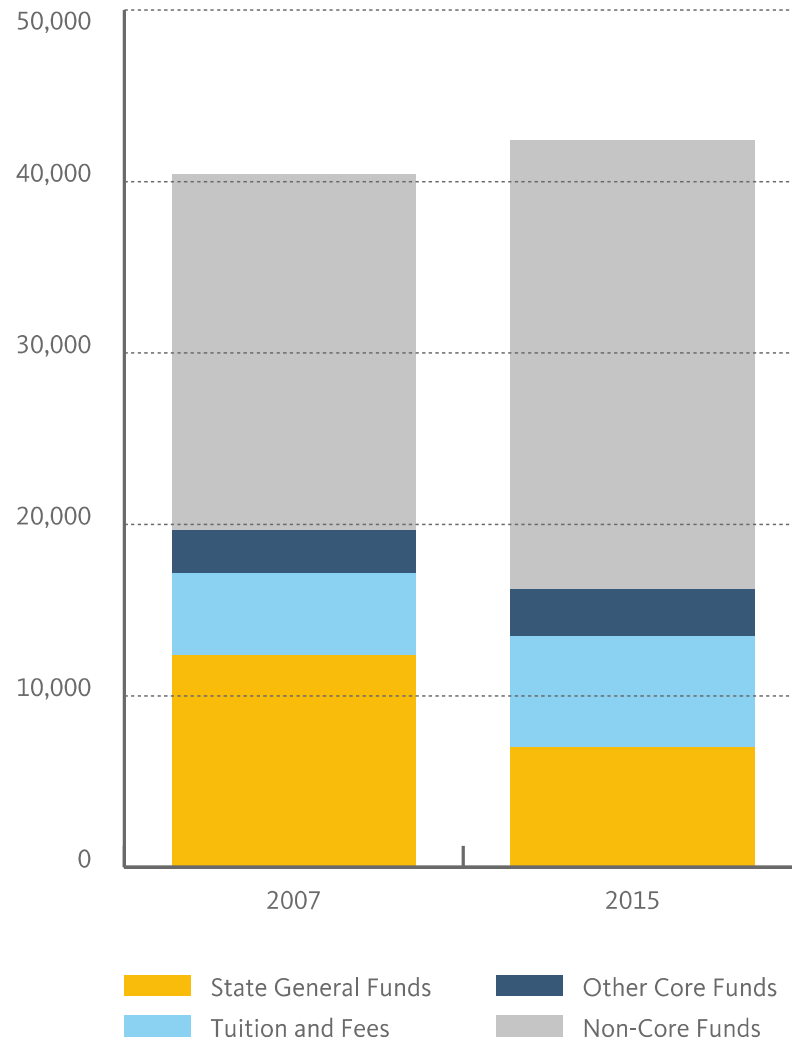
# The Number of UC Undergraduate Pell Grant, First Generation College and Underrepresented Minorities Has Grown Over Time



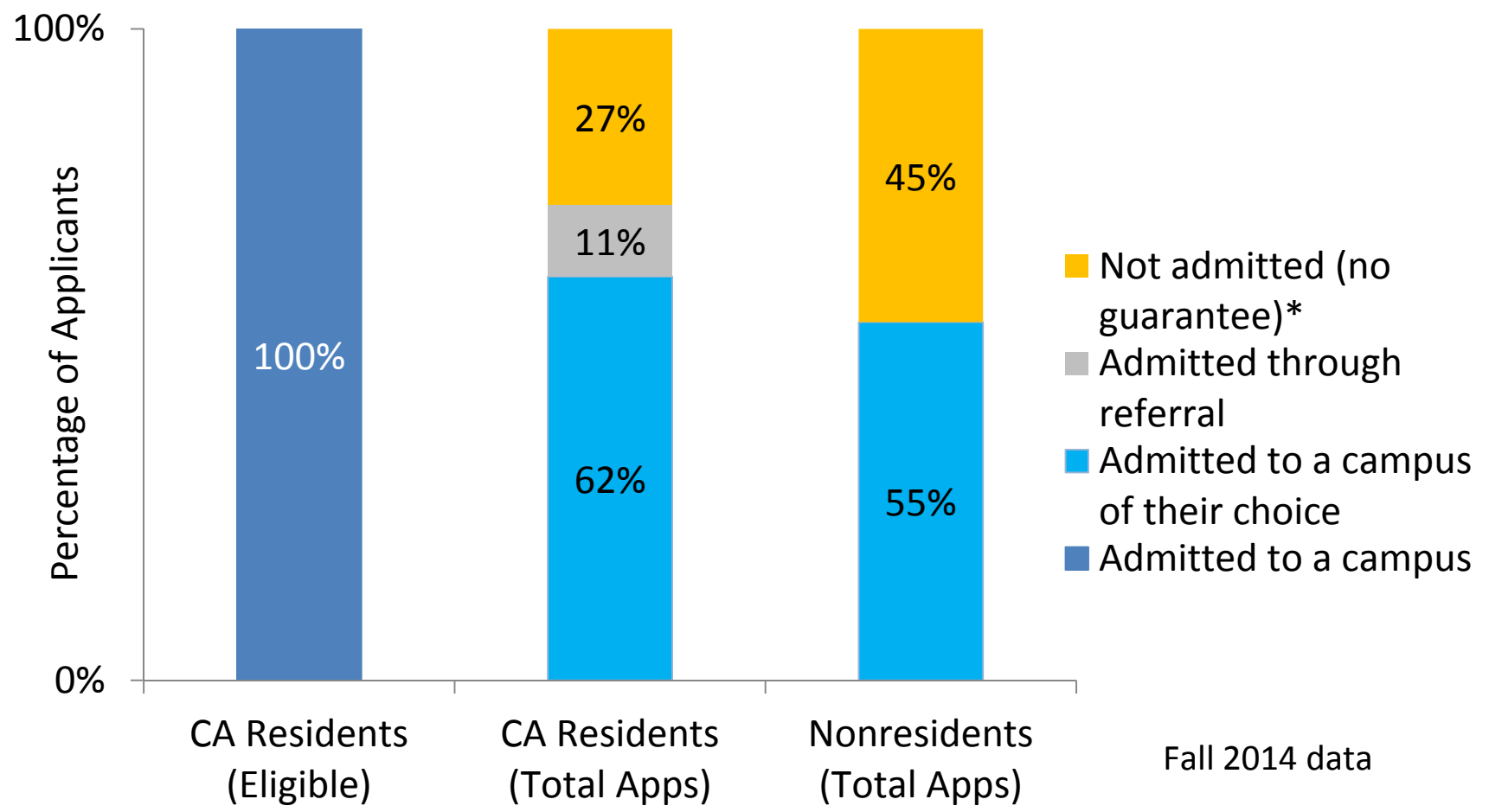
# Most Staff Growth Occurred in Medical Centers

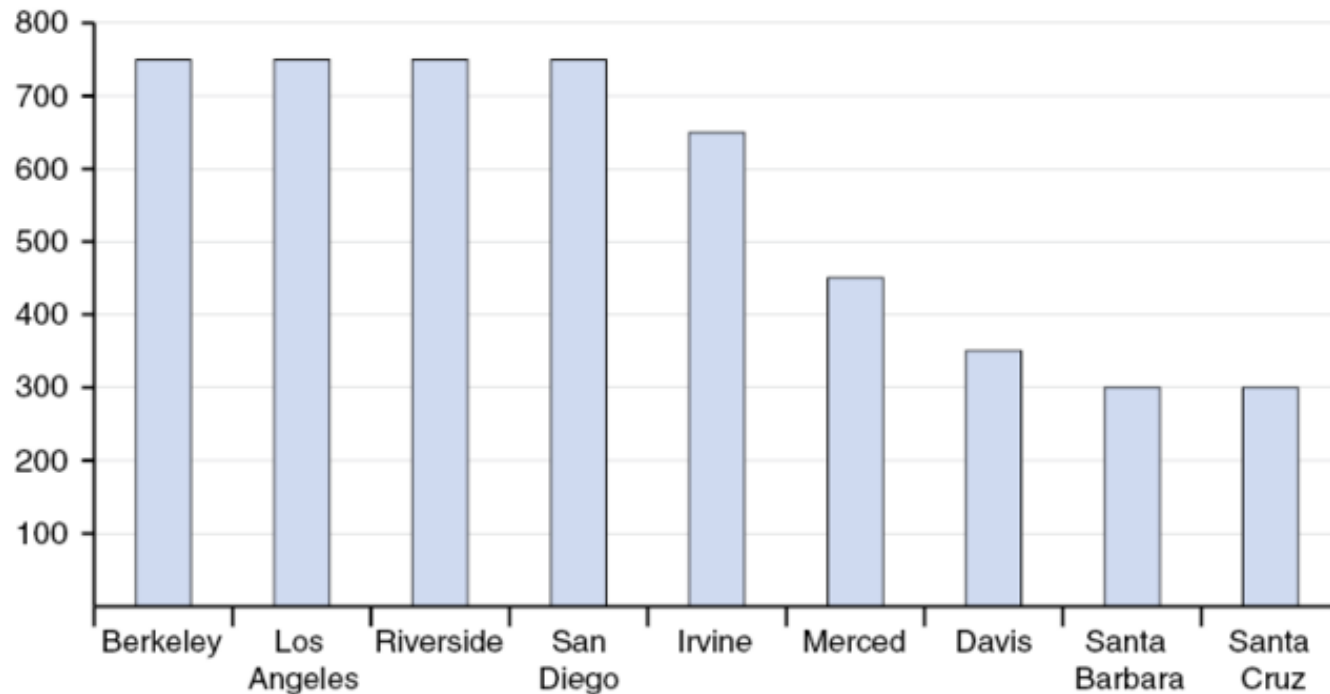

*UC's Growth Plan, 2016-17 Compared to 2014-15*

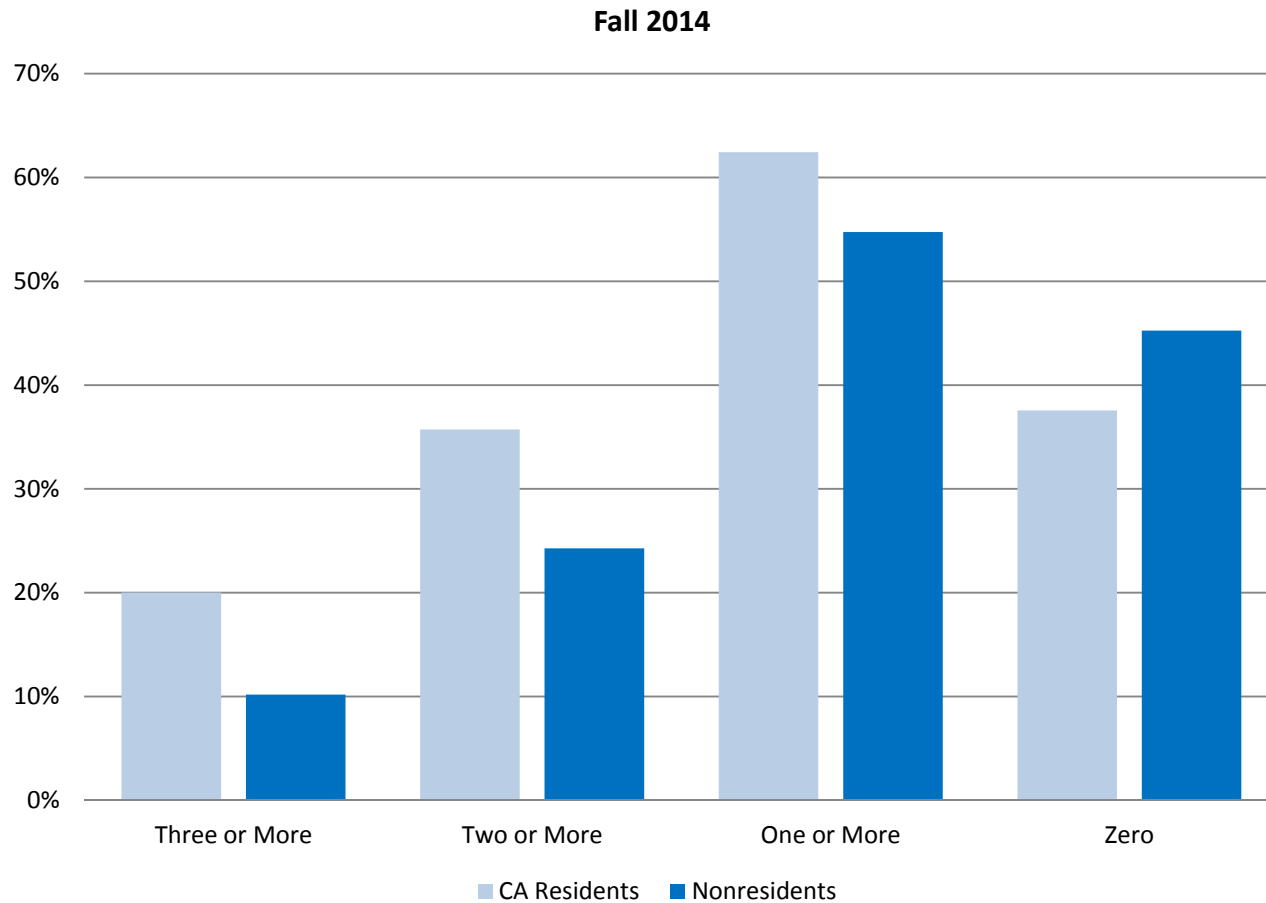
